

Explanation Guide for Washington State Assessment

Question:

1. This means on going problems in most of your subjects in middle school and junior high, this does not mean a few problems with a specific subject or class.
2. Is it very difficult to impossible for you to work from a test booklet to an answer sheet?
3. Not just normal problems, but is it something that you can't figure out even if you spend a great deal of time and effort?
4. Trouble would be that you could not get close on estimating the distance between objects. We are not talking an exact distance, only an estimate.
5. This means severe learning difficulties or mental retardation.
6. This means on going problems in most of your subjects in elementary school, this does not mean a few problems with a specific subject or class.
7. This means that you can't figure out math problems, mixing mathematical signs after spending a great deal of time and effort
8. This means, after much effort you can't understand and complete forms correctly with basic information such as your name, address, etc.
9. This means regularly used numbers such as a social security number, phone number, etc.
10. This means basic, common words used on a regular basis.
11. This means writing down short sentences or thoughts written on a chalkboard or given orally by someone speaking.
12. This is simple addition or subtraction in your head without writing the numbers down. Example: $5+6=11$ or $4-3=1$
13. This means a special education class, a special reading or math lab or did you have an IEP-Individualized Educational Plan?
